



Your textbooks will be shipped to the address you provide. If your are on campus, check the red box. If you are living off campus, use your off campus mailing address.

STEP 4 FINALIZE YOUR PAYMENT AND CONFIRM PURCHASE:

A TEXTBOOK VOUCHER is added to every student account. This is your payment method. If you have a zero voucher balance, contact the library as soon as possible (do not add your credit card information, we cannot reimburse you). Make sure to confirm your purchase.






Directions to Haskell Indian Nations University
