Retention rate. A Measure of the rate at which student persist in their educational program at an institution, expressed as a percentage of first-time, full-time bachelors (or equivalent) degree-seeking undergraduates from the previous fall who are again enrolled in the current fall. For all other institutions this is the percentage of first-time degree/certificate-seeking students from the previous fall who either re-enrolled or successfully completed their program by the current fall. Persistence Rate. Individual student measure. It refers to a student staying enrolled and continuing their academic journey from term to term. The above chart illustrates the rate that all students "persist" from fall to spring.

Graduation Rates. Data are collected on the number of students entering the institution as full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students in a particular year (cohort), by race/ethnicity and gender; the number completing their program within 150 percent of normal time to completion; the number that transfer to other institutions if transfer is part of the institution's mission.

Transfer-Out Rate. Total number of students who are known to have transferred out of the reporting institution within 150% of normal time to completion divided by the adjusted cohort.
