- 3 Login to your Student Portal. Check your student portal account for information about (grades, billing, financial aid, enrolling for classes). For questions, contact the Office of the Registrar's at Registrar@haskell.edu.
- 4 Take your ALEKS Math Placement Test. Register and complete the Math placement test – Any questions please email: mathdepartment@haskell.edu or call 785-832-6630.
- 5 Enroll for classes with an advisor. List of faculty advisors are on the HINU website at www.haskell.edu/academics/ and the advisors are listed on page 9 of this booklet.
- 6 Access Class Schedule via Student Portal – make sure it is correct and accurate. Students can access their portal via student.haskell.edu
- 7 Did you apply for Housing? <https://www.haskell.edu/housing/> . Submit a Housing application via DocuSign (every semester) If you choose to live on campus, you will find a housing contract. Questions? Contact haskell.housing@haskell.edu. Refer to page 11.
- 8 After enrolling – purchase your textbooks through Haskell eCampus www.haskell.ecampus.com. Questions? Contact Tommaney Hall at library@haskell.edu. More information on page 10.
- 9 Login to your Blackboard. As a Haskell student most of your content and interaction will be through Bb. Access your courses, free tutoring, and other forms such as changing your major. Contact ITHelpDesk@haskell.edu for questions.
- 10 Walk to your class locations or be familiar with where they are located. The map is at the end of this booklet.

Directions to Haskell Indian Nations University

From the East: From Kansas City, follow K-10 west into Lawrence. Turn left (south) at the intersection of 23rd St. and Barker Ave.

From the West: From Topeka, follow I-70 east and take exit 202 to Iowa St. Continue south for 3 miles to Clinton Parkway (23rd St.) and turn left (east). Continue east for 1.5 miles to Barker Ave. and turn right (south).
