

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)

Student Information and Disbursement Guide

Overview

The Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) is a federal grant program for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need. FSEOG funding is limited and awarded by the Financial Aid Office.

Who Can Receive FSEOG?

Students must complete the FAFSA, demonstrate exceptional financial need, be enrolled in an eligible undergraduate program, meet federal eligibility requirements, and maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP).

Availability of Funding

FSEOG funding is limited and available only while funds remain. Meeting eligibility requirements does not guarantee an award.

Award Notification

Students selected for FSEOG funding will receive an official financial aid offer through their student portal.

Disbursement of Funds

FSEOG funds are disbursed after student Pell grants are disbursed, and eligibility and enrollment have been verified, and are applied to institutional charges before any credit balance is refunded.

Maintaining Eligibility

Students must maintain SAP, remain eligible for federal aid, and report changes that may affect eligibility.

Frequently Asked Questions

Do I have to repay FSEOG? Generally, no.

Is funding guaranteed? No, awards depend on the availability of funds.

Website Notice: FSEOG awards are contingent upon the availability of federal funding. Receipt of an award in one year does not guarantee future funding.
